Secretary's Report

Once again I have pleasure in presenting our Report and Balance Sheet for your approval. Over the past year the Country's economic situation has not reached any high notes and unfortunately this seems to have reflected on the Balance Sheet. Certainly no records have been broken and this is due to our policy of keeping bar prices as low and competitive as possible and the extra expenditure inside and outside the Club. Interior and exterior decoration was a necessity and makes our Club room much more attractive. The security system has been modernised at further expense and is very efficient.

Since the last Annual General Meeting many successful functions have been held here in the Club room and Lounge. We began with a welcome back for Ernie Mills, who returned to Huddersfield for a month's holiday last October. As many of his playing colleagues from the 1930 Era as possible were invited to a social gathering and buffet in the Club Lounge. Another event held in April celebrated the 60th anniversary of Fartown winning the Challenge Cup at Headingley. Hubert Pogson who scored two tries in that game was taken back to tread the ground on which he was a Fartown hero that day so many years ago. This was followed by a meal at the George Hotel after appearing on the Calendar programme at Yorkshire Television and then back here to meet past and present players and club officials. Our lounge housed the re-formation of the Fartown Players Association from interest kindled from our players social evenings. Tuesday night now finds our own darts and domino teams competing in the Huddersfield Winter League which the darts team won last season.

Recently we sponsored Huddersfield's first ever Programme Fair. Sporting Programme Dealers came from Lancashire and different parts of Yorkshire to offer their collections to interested buyers. The attendance over the day reached 300 and our Club will surely house another Fair in the near future.

Trevor Leathley was chosen as the supporters fairest and most loyal player of 1979-80 season and was presented with a tankard by Supporters Club President Peter Thomas before the game with Dewsbury at Easter.

The Supporters Queen was chosen at one of our regular monthly discos and once again Miss. Julie Fitzmaurice was the winner.

Our under 19 team are this season playing in The Pennine League under the able direction of Cyril Tunnacliffe and Neil Whittaker. Cyril was last season chosen Sportsman of the Year by the British Amateur Rugby League Association, an honour of which we are all proud. The teams Easter Trip once again took them to France. Next Easter new ground will be broached when the team play two teams in London.

Season 1980-81 in amateur Rugby League will benefit from our sponsorship of a new trophy. The Inter-Town teams Knockout competition winners will receive the Frank Dyson Cup. We are providing the trophy and presenting the two finalists with individual mementos each season.

Next June will see our Club celebrate it's Diamond Jubilee. Therefore many attractive events are about to be planned but to make them really successful the Committee will welcome anyone who is interested to join us and serve the Club and Rugby League and make our deficit into a record profit.
