Huddersfield Athletic Club opens St John's Gymnasium and merges with Huddersfield St John's Cricket Club	1875

sign Douglas Clark; Yorkshire Cup winners	1909

Fred Longstaff killed at Battle of the Somme	1916
stopped playing owing to lack of money and players; Douglas Clark badly injured at Battle of Passchendaele	1917
PART 5, 1919-1945: Between the Wars and World War II	
Challenge Cup winners in club's first appearance at Wembley	1933
Challenge Cup winners, beating Bradford over two matches	1945
Yorkshire Cup winners, twice	1919
Yorkshire Cup winners	1926
begin playing in the War Emergency League, Yorkshire section	1939
Challenge Cup runners-up	1935
Yorkshire League winners	1922
Herbert Sherwood drowns; club stage testimonial match for his family	1942

club name reverts to 'Huddersfield'; ground name reverts to 'Fartown'	1988
PART 8, 1996-2015:Summer Rugby and Super League	
merged with Sheffield Eagles to become Huddersfield-Sheffield Giants	1999
League Leaders' Shield winners; Danny Brough named 'Man of Steel'	2013
Divisional Championship Final winners, beating Hull 18-0 at Old Trafford; promoted to Super League	1997
relegated from Super League	2001
renamed Huddersfield Giants	1996
promoted to Super League, scoring a record 1156 points	2002
first season in the new Super League	1998
Challenge Cup runners-up; Brett Hodgson named 'Man-of-Steel'	2009
