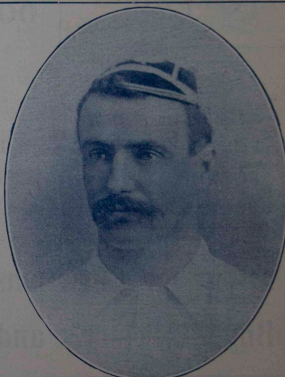

As everybody knows, the season just closing has been an unfortunate one for the Huddersfield Football Club. However, if one man's efforts could have averted the disasters which have befallen the local team, it would have been the subject of our portrait this week. **BOOTHROYD**, who has undoubtedly made his mark as one of the finest wing three-quarters in the country, was born at Honley, April 16th, 1872. He played first in 1890, with Netherland, and the year after, as forward, with Honley. Joining Huddersfield in 1892, he played with the A team the first season, but his merits soon obtained recognition, and he was selected to play in the first team the following season. Chosen for this season's county trial match, he has played against Cheshire at Leeds, and Lancashire at Oldham and Huddersfield. The total number of his tries last season was fifteen, and up to the present time he has this season sixteen tries to his credit. Whilst Boothroyd's pace is fast, his coolness seldom forsakes him even under the most trying circumstances, and he bids fair to emulate the brilliant records of Dyson and Brooke.

“Coming of age” of the Glee and Madrigal Society

The members of this admirable association of local vocalists, will worthily celebrate the attainment of its majority to-morrow (Saturday) evening, when the concert to be given in the Town Hall promises to be of an unusually interesting and enjoyable character. I trust the public will rally loyally to their support and by giving them a bumper house, show they are not unmindful of the invaluable services which the society, so ably presided over for sixteen years by Mr. Joseph Woodhead, J.P., has rendered to the cause of English vocal music in this district.

Ramsden Street Musical Society.

This young but promising society gave their second concert of the season in the Schoolroom last Friday evening, before a large and appreciative audience. The major part of the programme was occupied by the performance of Mr. F. H. Cowen's cantata “The Rose Maiden.” Whilst in no sense a great work, it contains some exceedingly melodious numbers, chiefly of a pastoral character, and these were in the main pleasingly and effectively rendered by the chorus and principals under the watchful and intelligent direction of Mr. James Whitfield, to whom is due much of the credit for securing so satisfactory a result from the comparatively slender resources at his disposal. With a little strengthening in the male voice department, and rather more restraint on the part of the soprano, even still better results may be confidently anticipated. The utmost credit must be given to Miss Crosland and Mr. J. Wrigley for their very artistic, tuneful, and expressive rendering of the soprano and tenor solos and duets, although evident nervousness detracted somewhat from the success of Miss A. M. Swindle's efforts in the contralto music, and an unfortunate hoarseness prevented Mr. C. P. Baines from doing justice to his naturally fine baritone voice. In the absence of an orchestra, Miss Pease (pianoforte) and Mr. J. A. Dyson (harmonium) are to be sincerely congratulated on the admirable taste, skill, and perfect usefulness with which they supplied its place in the introduction and accompaniments, and thus materially contributed to the success of the performance.

Pool's Myriorama at the Town Hall.
