OFFICIAL NOTES.

In our last week-end's programme we recorded our regret that to-day's important match with Dewsbury at Fartown should unavoidably clash with the Police—Civil Defence v. R.A.F. Cup-tie allocated to the "Town" ground. However, we hope our local public will prove themselves really football minded to-day in such increased measure that both games will be very well patronized.

Keighley gave us a bit of a fright ere we staged a last 20 minutes recovery in which period we turned a 5 clear points deficit into a 10-5 victory. Allman, the Featherstone centre "guest" player for the day, scored our first try, and later paved the way for a combined movement which resulted in McManus crossing near the posts. Wade, at full-back, vice Belshaw, acquitted himself well and kicked two goals.

And now we welcome Dewsbury—present League leaders—to our ground once more. We hope, they and we may be able to announce "team as selected" in which case a feast of good football is well nigh assured. As will be remembered we ran the Crown Flatt side to a narrow margin in the "two leg" Yorkshire Cup Final—two splendid games—but our victory in the 2nd leg at Fartown did not wipe out Dewsbury's points advantage gained in the 1st leg and so the Cup found a well earned resting place at Crown Flatt. To-day, League points are at stake and it is we who will fight hard to join Dewsbury in the selected top four. Here's to another great game and may the better side gain the day.

We are drawn to play Halifax in the 1st round of the Rugby League Cup. The venue will probably be changed to Thrum Hall for the 1st leg in order that we shall not Clash with Huddersfield "Town's" Cup tie with Bradford at Leeds Road on that day, i.e. next Saturday, March 13th.
