Points were plentiful on a heavy ground at the Barley Mow last Saturday and our

team are to be congratulated on the margin of their success. Cooper and Anderson each crossed for four tries, the other two going to Walsh and Whitehead. Only two goals were kicked (both by Bawden) as most of the tries were scored well wide of the posts. Bramley struggled gamely but were well beaten long before the close and it is pleasing to record that many of the home spectators spoke appreciatively of our display after the game.

As has been announced in the Press we have, at the player's own request, placed Bernard Madden on the transfer list. Despite his versatility—he has filled the centre, wing and stand-off positions—Madden has been unable to command a regular place in our first team this season. Since his first game for us on November 24th, 1945, he has made 57 first team appearances, scoring 5 goals, 34 tries (112 points). He is 25, stands 5ft, 9ins, and weighs 12st, 4lb.



We extend hearty greetings to our visitors today, for we rarely have the pleasure of entertaining them at Fartown. The last time they were here is as far back as October 31st, 1936, when we beat them by 14 points to 5, our scorers that day being Towill and Sep. Aspinall a try each and 4 goals to Bert Lockwood. With such a lengthy time between we cannot take past meetings at Fartown as a guide to the likely result of today's encounter, but judging by the game at Naughton Park last month the issue is likely to be closely

The "Chemics," as they are popularly called in Lancashire, certainly have a record to be respected and their defensive powers are known to all followers of the code. It will be our job today to break down that defence which has already held us at bay

once this season.

As usual, Widnes are relying on local talent and they depend upon excellent team-work rather than individual "stars," with kicking reduced to a minimum. The captain is Hughes, a centre three-quarter, who is a school-teacher (like his rival captain today) and served as an officer during the War. The other centre is 19 years old Albert Naughton who has the makings of a fine footballer and has two brothers playing in the pack. John Naughton takes the loose forward position, with brother Dan in the second row.

When Tommy McCue was seriously injured earlier in the season there were many who forecast that Widnes would not maintain their high position. They have, however, discovered a worthy successor at scrum-half in the diminutive Anderson,

while Butler can also give them good service in that position. One of this season's newcomers is the full back and goal-kicker, Gilligan, who has kicked 24 goals. Reynolds, at stand-off, has played since the club was re-started following the war and was the leading try-scorer during the first post-war season with 22 tries to his name.

Regarding the match at Widnes on December 20th last, we are pleased to publish the following letter from a Widnes supporter expressing a sporting spirit that rises above club partisanship.
