**Mr. Harold Tetley** (Team Manager and Coach) is aged 47, and has been connected with the Rugby League game for many years. As a player he represented New Zealand from 1935-1938, and captained New Zealand in 1937.

**R. Haggie** (Otahuhu Club, Auckland), 21, 12 st. 4 lbs. A Maori player who has played some good football and believes in an attacking game. Could be that this tour will give him the experience he needs. Is an accomplished goal kicker.

**B. Robertson** (Richmond Club, Auckland), 22, 11 st. 2 lbs. Not a newcomer to English grounds for he was one of the youngsters who made good while on the last tour but badly injured a leg muscle, which caused him to lose two seasons after his return home. Was on the wing

for N.Z. against France in the Tests this year and has been playing really fine football. A try scorer in the Swinton Test. **T. Baxter** (Richmond Club, Auckland), 26, 12 st. 6 lbs. Captain of the side. Although only 26 he is a Test match veteran. First played for N.Z. against Australia in 1949. Toured England and France four years ago and went to Australia also. Was not available for World Cup tour. The Aussies regarded him as the most punishing centre in the game.

**W. Sorenson** (Ponsonby Club, Auckland), 23, 13 st. 4 lbs. Was on tour four years ago but did not play in any of the Tests against England. Played against Australia in Tests two years ago and went with the World Cup side last year.

**V. Bakalich** (Richmond Club Auckland), 26, 12 st. First came to the top in 1954 when he played against England. A winger who plays quite good football and possibly the best has not yet been seen of him. Has represented Auckland.

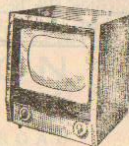

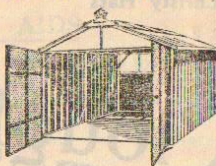
