1908-09—Dinny Lutge. 1911-12—C. H. McKivatt. 1921-22—Les Cubitt. 1929-30—Tom Gorman. 1933-34—Frank McMillan. 1937-38—Wally Prigg. 1948-49—Colin Maxwell. 1952-53—Clive Churchill. 1956—Ken Kearney.

It is worthy of note that on the 1948-49 trip the Australians had three different captains in the three Tests. They were Colin Maxwell, Wally O'Connell and Bill Tyquin (the latter an elder brother of the present tourist).

#### Flashback

Saturday, November 10th, 1956—an important date in this season's Fartown fixture list, bringing as it does the eagerly awaited visit of the Australian Tour Team.

But November 10th has another important place in Fartown and Rugby League history. It was on this day, fifty years ago, that Harold Wagstaff played his first game of senior football. He was only 15½ when he made his debut for us at the Barley Mow in an age when radio, television and atomic development were dreams of the future.

Harold Wagstaff is remembered as the "Prince of Centres," and he was as well-known in Australia as over here for he led two English Tour Teams "down-under." He died in 1939, but the fame of "Waggy" will never fade so long as the game of R.L. football is played.

Clive Churchill (Vice-Capt.) Rated in Australia the best full-back in post-war football. Had played thirty two consecutive Tests before missing this year's games against New Zealand through a broken wrist. Made splendid return to club football after injury recovered. Is the most fearless tackling full-back Australia has had and is a great attacking player. May have lost a little speed but is playing with greater judgment. Becomes the first back and only the second player to make three trips to England (the other being Wally Prigg). Skipper on 1952 tour.

Gordon Clifford. First overseas trip but played for Australia in second test against Kiwis this year, making great debut despite breaking wrist early in game. An attacking full-back with a lot of speed. Safe handler, good defender and a great goal-kicker. Was a schoolboy champion as five-eighth and centre and started club

football in 1948. Has been in first grade since 1951, and was a popular choice for this tour.

Don "Bandy" Adams. Nuggetty and bowlegged, Adams was the star of the Australian season and was outstanding in Tests against New Zealand. Plays either wing without worrying and is a most determined player. Scrupulously clean he sickens his opponents with heavy tackles and he is extremely hard to hold because of his build. Is a terrific favourite with Sydney Cricket Ground crowds. Was coached by Col Maxwell and former Fartowner Ron Bailey at Maitland where his family has a farm. Has played nine matches for N.S.W. and was in all Tests against the Kiwis. Scored 27 tries in 15 games.

Denis Flannery. A 1952 Kangaroo. His career has been hampered by injuries but is a solid winger with lots of speed and is hard to stop. Was schoolboy sprint cham-

Dicky Poole. Captain-coach of the strong Newtown Club in Sydney for the past two seasons. One of Australia's greatest players in the Kiwi Tests this year, and a last-minute selection for the third Test against France last year. Developed into a very rugged player who has shown outstanding form on wet ground. Dribbles ball like a soccer player. Played League since a tiny schoolboy and has been in first grade since 1950. Played for Sydney versus Great Britain in 1954 and reserve for Third Test that year. Intelligent type of player who will develop still further on tour.

Kevin O'Brien. Utility back of the party, being able to play full-back, wing, centre

A most penetrating centre. Watson impressed when in England in 1954 with the World Cup team. Toured New Zealand with Australia in 1953. Played in all three Tests against the 1954 Lions and also starred against France in last year's Tests.

Tom Payne. Baby of the side and one with a great future ahead of him. Has been coached by the redoubtable Mick Madsen and Duncan Thompson at Toowoomba. Was a first grader at 18, first as five-eighth and then at centre. In first season of representative football this year was selected as reserve back for the Kiwi Test. Played for Queensland against N.S.W. and Kiwis. Has plenty of speed, is a good handler and is a sound tackler.

Ian Johnston. Played as a junior in Newcastle before joining Vic Hey at Parramatta in 1948. Was centre alongside Hey and in 1949 won trip to New Zealand with Australian team. Played 93 first-grade games with Parramatta before going to country. Returned to Sydney this year as centre with Western Suburbs. Played only a few minor representative games later in the season but every critic tipped him for selection

Bobby Banks. Comes from a footballing family with father, uncles, cousins all well-known in Newcastle district. Real name is Marjoribanks but this has been abbreviated with all the family's footballers. Started his football at Central Newcastle. Played for North Queensland against France in 1951 and in 1952 played for Queensland. Toured New Zealand with Australian team in 1953 and was selected for all three tests against Great Britain in 1954, missing one through injury. Also toured with World Cup team 1954. Duncan Thompson rates him the best team player he has seen for years.

Keith Holman. A great player in England in 1952 but is better now. The most rugged half-back Australia has had in many years. Has the enthusiasm of a schoolboy and plays every game as hard as a Test Played in all three 1950 Tests and has hardly missed one against Great Britain, France or N.Z. since. Has played in 25 tests, 29 games for N.S.W., 11 for Sydney versus Country and several minor matches. Struck peak form against Kiwis
