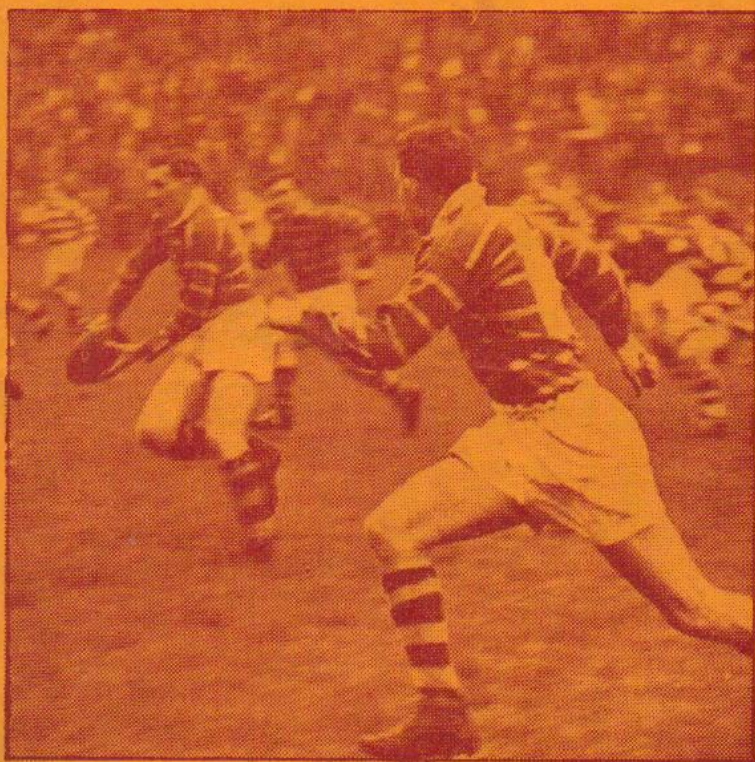

DICK CRACKNELL

First appeared with our Fartown "A" team in September, 1946, when still only a youngster. He played as an amateur for a few years before signing professional forms in 1949.

While at Fartown he won several representative honours, playing three times for Great Britain, four times for England and on eight occasions for Yorkshire.

He scored 113 tries in 111 appearances with our first team, and 57 tries in 64 "A" team appearances.

We transferred Dick to Oldham in October, 1953, since when he has helped to put the Oldham club in its present prominent position.

His scoring record with the Water-sheddings team prior to last Saturday was 24 goals, and 79 tries

OFFICIAL NOTES

Our friends from Oldham, making one of their all too rare visits to Fartown, are very welcome opponents this evening. They come as League Champions, Lancashire Cup Holders and Lancashire League Winners.

Three Cups in one season is the next best thing to the All Four feat. Oldham looked quite capable of sweeping the board clean last season, but a somewhat surprising defeat at Leigh put an end to their Wembley hopes.

The men from Watersheddings are rightly regarded as being one of the best, if not the best team in the game at the present time. They have won a reputation for playing exhilarating, open football and we look forward to an enjoyable and sporting match tonight.

Not all their players have been seen at Fartown before, but some of them are familiar to us. Dick Cracknell needs no

introduction to Fartowners, and Huddersfield people have been pleased at the part he has played in Oldham's advance this last season or so. John Etty has surprised many people since he left Batley and has proved a prolific scorer on the left wing.

Bernard Ganley, son of a former Fartowner, has been elected captain of the team this season. An accurate goal-kicker, Ganley broke his own club record last season and his full total of goals for Oldham is now 764.

Oldham have built up a strong pack in which men like Don Vines, a champion weight-lifter from Wales, and Derek Turner are the more recent newcomers. The latest forward acquisition is Roger Dufty, who was signed at the end of last season. Dufty played for London Irish, the R.A.F. and Middlesex, and was on the fringe of R.U. international honours.

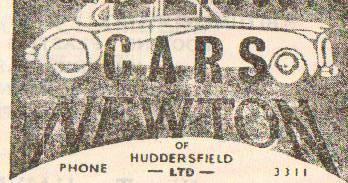
