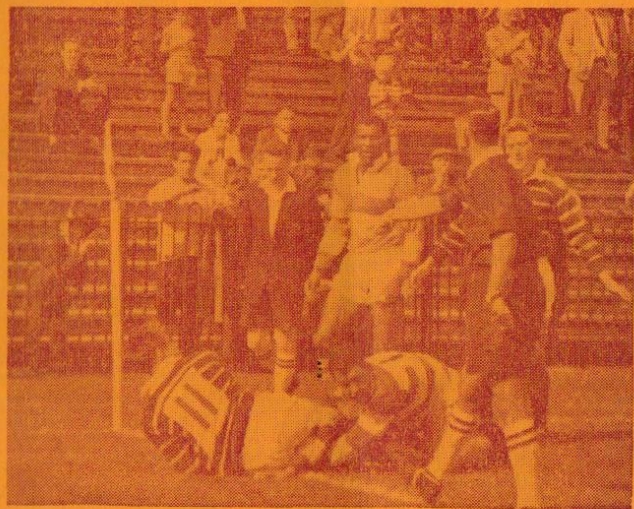

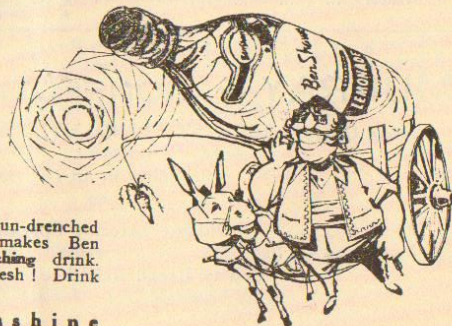

FARTOWNERS PAST AND PRESENT

No. 47 — Harry Deighton

From the York Imperial Under 17 team to a Wembley appearance in a little over twelve months—that is the story of Harry Deighton's introduction to senior football.

We signed Harry on April 6th, 1961, and he played in the "A" team for the rest of that season and the beginning of the next. His first team chance came on August 26th, when he made his debut against Hull K. R. at Craven Park and scored a try in a 17-8 victory.

That 1961-62 season was one in which we surprised the critics with a series of unexpected victories. Deighton was the most inexperienced member of the side but he fitted well into the team and did his full share of the work.

Nor did the signing of Gwyn Davies for the stand-off position cost Harry his place, for he continued to pull his weight at centre. He played in 36 first team games (24 of them at stand-off) and it was fitting reward that he should play in both the R.L. Cup Final at Wembley and the Championship Final at Odsal.

In more recent times he has shown further versatility by turning out at full-back or scrum half. To date he has played in 72 first team matches, scoring six tries, and he has a similar number of tries for the "A" team in 17 appearances.

Harry, who is single, is a motor mechanic.

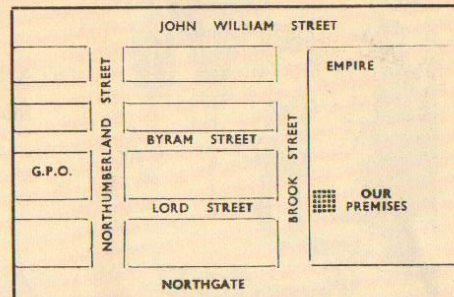
