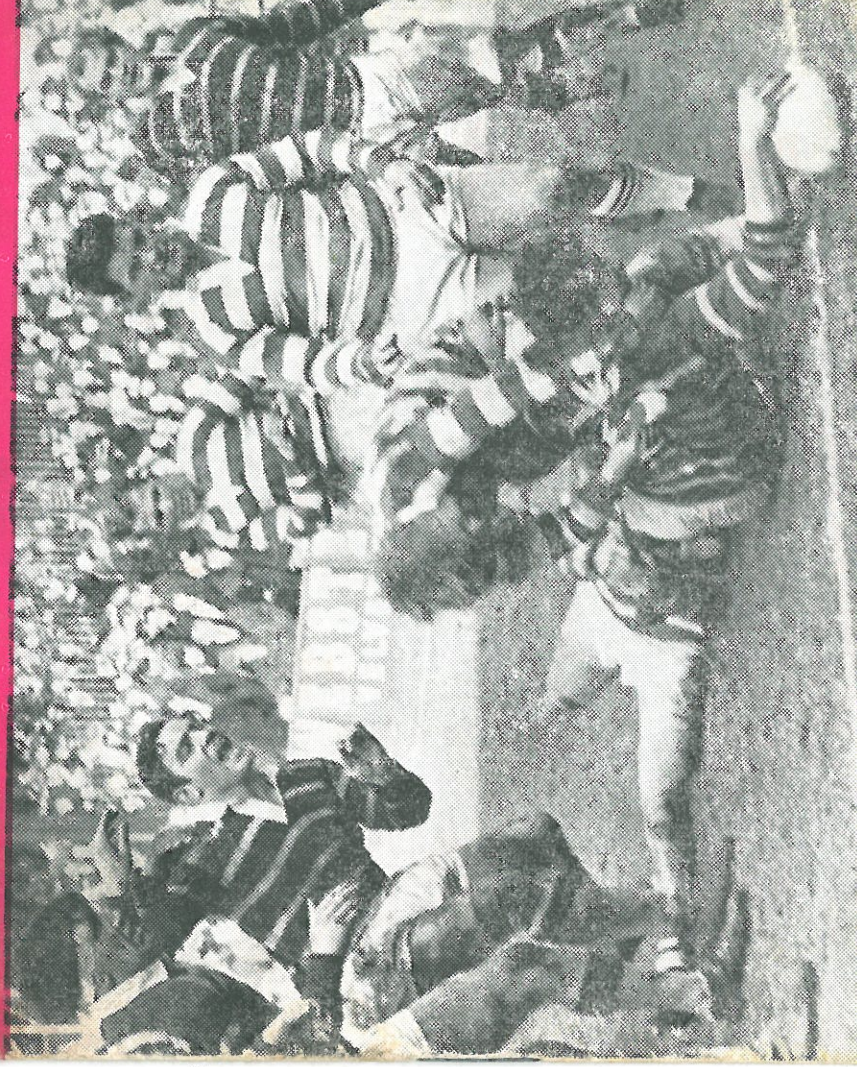

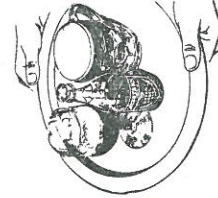

OFFICIAL NOTES



Sunday Football at Fartown! A few weeks ago we played our first Sunday game—a re-arranged League fixture at York. This afternoon we play at Fartown on a Sunday for the first time.

The occasion is, of course, our third round R.L. cup-tie against Featherstone Rovers, to whom we extend a cordial welcome.

Not everyone is happy about Sunday football, but there were several factors which led to the switching of this tie from yesterday to to-day. It clashed with the other third round games and also with Huddersfield Town's home fixture against Derby County.

By playing today we are giving many R.L. enthusiasts the chance of seeing two cup matches, and travelling conditions—

particularly through Wakefield—should be much better for spectators than they would have been yesterday.

What the attendance will be at Fartown this afternoon is a matter for conjecture as we go to press but we are hoping for fine weather and a big crowd.

In meeting Featherstone Rovers we are aware that we are up against a team with a great cup reputation. They are the Cup holders, and many here at Fartown today will remember the competent way in which they dealt with Leeds in the Semi-final on this ground and then disposed of Barrow at Wembley.

That was Featherstone's second visit to the Empire Stadium. The first was in 1952, but they were beaten by Working-ton Town that year. In subsequent seasons they got as far as the Semi-final on several occasions, including three seasons in succession.

Only once before have Huddersfield and Featherstone Rovers clashed in the Rugby League Challenge Cup Competition. That was on February 10th, 1934, when we beat the Rovers by 19 points to 4 in a first round tie at Post Office Road.

The teams that day will revive memories for supporters of both clubs. Here they are:-

FEATHERSTONE R.-Lockwood; J. Denton, Malpass, Hammond, Asquith; Dennis, J. Evans; Barracough, Lomas, Flaherty, Taylor, Plenderleith and L. Morgan.

HUDDESFIELD-Scourfield; Mills, Brogden, Towill, Markham; Fiddes, Spencer; Roberts, Halliday, Sherwood, Tiffany, Talbot, Brindle.

Our tries were scored by Mills, Markham and Tiffany. Herbert Sherwood kicked 5 goals. The two Featherstone goals were kicked by Denton.

The referee was Mr. J. W. Webb of Broughton and the attendance was 5,266 with receipts of £290.

Two of the Featherstone players in that game were to become Fartowners later on—full back Bert Lockwood and hooker Jim Lomas.

After defeating Featherstone in the first round of that 1933-34 season we made further progress by beating Hull (11-7) and London Highfield (21-2)—both games being played at Fartown—but we lost to Hunslet, the eventual trophy winners, in the semi-final at Belle Vue, Wakefield, by 7 points to 12.

Mackeson Contest

Leeds are winners of the Period Four Mackeson Contest which ended last week-

end. They have now won three Contests in succession, the first team to do so in the history of the six-years-old Mackeson point scoring contests.

Their winning points averages of 22.43, 24.01 and 23.22 show remarkable consistency for a spell of more than five months. Leeds are also well placed in the Main Contest for which there is a prize of 200 guineas.

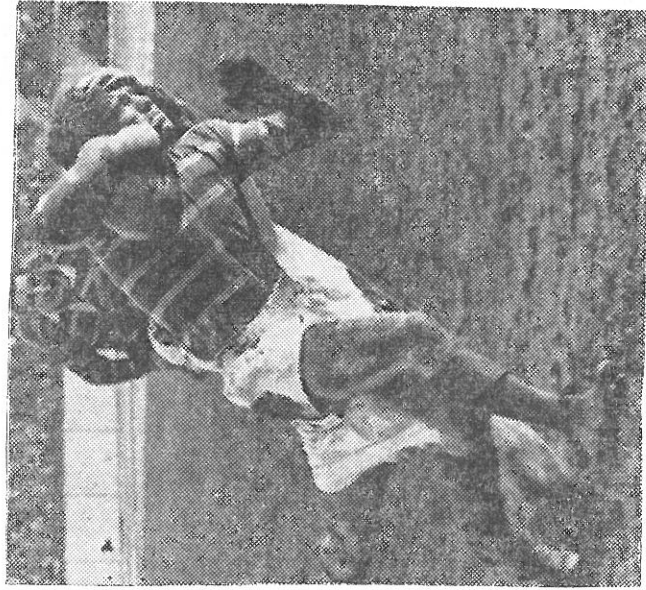
