



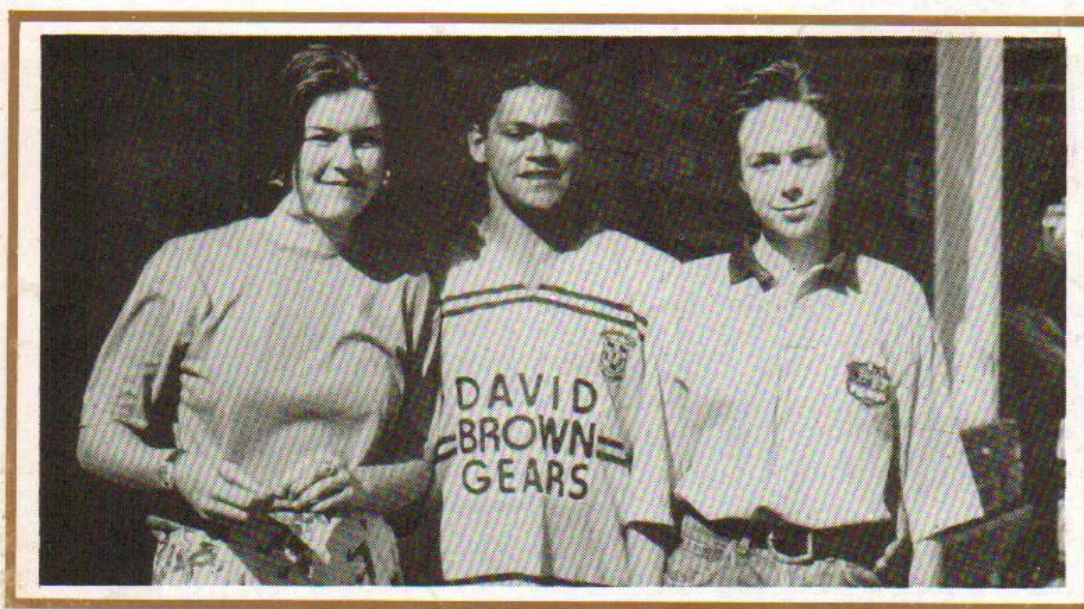

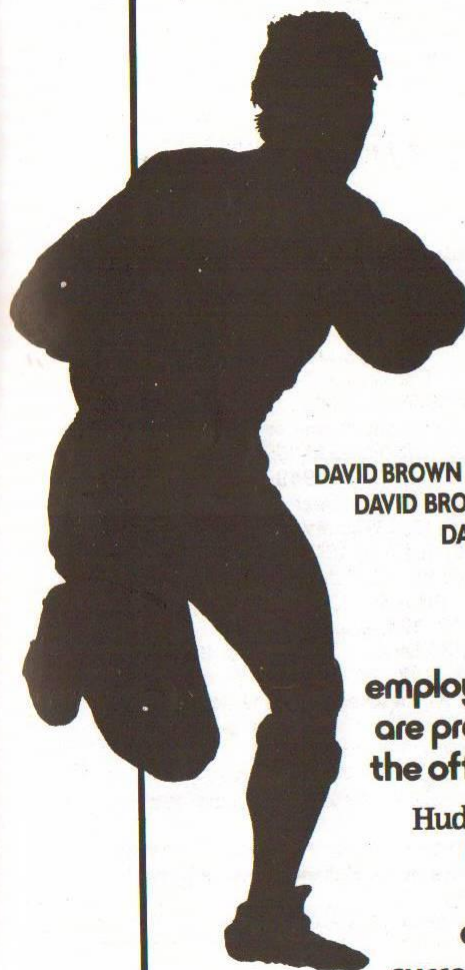

Doncaster finished ninth in Division Two last season winning 18 drawing 2 and losing 11 of their 28 league matches. Although we did not meet in the Championship, they were easy 23 points to 4 winners at Tattersfield in the Yorkshire Cup.

During the close season Dane O'Hara joined Doncaster from Hull, however he was injured in the Yorkshire Cup game against Halifax and may not play this evening. O'Hara is now exempt from the overseas quota after nine season

on Humberside and the 34 year old who has a record 36 Kiwi Test Caps was reported to have cost the South Yorkshire Club £8,000.

Coach, Dave Sampson is expected to have two overseas players in his line up this evening. Kiwi centre Carl Hall scored 16 tries last season and has returned again. Australian second row forward Ian French has signed a two year deal and had an outstanding spell at Castleford in 1985/86 when he played a major role in that club's last Wembley triumph. French is 28 years old and played for North Sydney, he is reputed to be a fitness fanatic with an excellent attitude to the game.

The third import, 22 year old Auckland forward Taima Tagaloa is one of New Zealand's brighter prospects. He played for Auckland and the President's XIII against Great Britain on the recent tour. Tagaloa is expected to arrive in the country in the next few days.

At full back should be Doncaster's most recent signing Wayne Race who joined from Bramley last week in a deal which saw Bramley receive Keith Jones and Ian Fletcher in exchange plus £10,000.

One of the wingers will no doubt be Mark Roache who scored 21 tries last season and created a new club try-scoring record with two in the final match of 1989/90 against Nottingham City.

The half backs will probably be Tony Zelig who signed from Wakefield Trinity last season and play-making Dean Carroll. Carroll has a knack of popping over important drop goals and will have to be watched carefully.

Doncaster have lots of experience available in their pack last season's deal which took exciting winger Neil Turner to the Boulevard saw former Lions tourist Wayne Proctor and the ex-Wembley and under-21 international prop Neil Puckering move to Tattersfield. The ageless Graham Idle leads the way defensively and one time Great Britain Test back-rower Dick Jasiewicz had an excellent 1989/90 season.

Just in case we think we are seeing double tonight's twin is Kevin Rayne — it was Keith at Batley in the Yorkshire Cup.

The first home league game of the season is always an exciting prospect. Let's hope for a good game and of course a Fartown victory.

DARREN PRICE Age 22, Signed in the close season from Castleford for £10,000. Darren is a very aggressive and speedy utility Back.

DANE O'HARA Age 34, Signed from Hull in the close season Dane is perhaps the best known of all Kiwi's in England. Playing either Wing or Centre, new club captain Dane is hoping to pass on his undoubted experience.

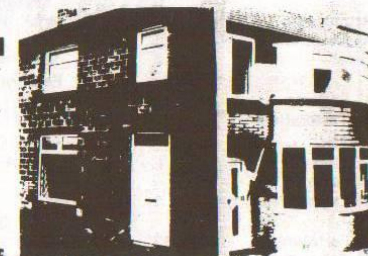
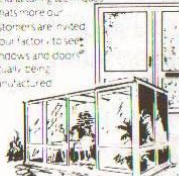

HUDDERSFIELD AND DONCASTER OVER THE YEARS

The first fixture between the two clubs was in Doncaster's first season in the Rugby League on October 13th, 1951. Doncaster were victorious by 18 points to 10 and followed this with a 25 points to 9 home victory in the 1952/53 season. However, it was not until December 15th, 1985 that Doncaster had their first success at Fartown.
