THE HISTORY OF HUNSLET RLFC

1969 - 70

The Lazenby Cup was the usual opener for the season with Leeds retaining the trophy 39-9. Phil Sanderson, a young loose forward made his debut in the second row in this game, on August 1st, the season starting earlier in these times. The following week the County Cup started before any league fixtures were played, a bad idea which was later abandoned. We travelled to the Minster City but were despatched by York to the tune of 20 points to 7.

We only won two of our first eight league games, both at home, but in the ninth game we got our first away victory at Barrow by 12-10. We suffered some good and bad results throughout the season, the good points being wins versus Wakefield, Hull, Swinton and Halifax with narrow defeats at Bradford, Halifax, Castleford by 5 points (they were 2nd in the table) and two good performances against top club Leeds. We also did the double over Dewsbury and took 3 points from York.

Offset against these however were a big defeat at Doncaster, a defeat at bottom club, Blackpool, at Keighley 8-26 and at Wakefield 3-59 while Barrow beat us at home 10-13 in the last match of the season.

On November 9th the first ever 1st team match at Parkside on a Sunday was played (the 'A' team had experimented with a couple of Sunday games). The opponents for this fixture were Keighley and the team was:— Marshall; B. Lee, Clark, Chamberlain, Thompson; Morgan, Hunt, Larkin, Maskill, Crewdson, Hepples, Payne (Baldwinson), Sanderson. We won 15-8 with 3 goals by Marshall and tries by Clark 2 and Lee.

New players this season besides Sanderson were Geoff Crewdson, Eric Payne and Dave Tucker, all forwards from Keighley, York and Castleford respectively, while juniors who made debuts were Pete Rycroft, Robert Buglass, Peter Cain, Dave Barrass, Lewis Cardiss, Geoff Nicholls, Steve Blake from the York area and Alan Griffiths a loose forward from the Castleford area, most of them gave good service. Pete Dunn was transferred to Leeds, Brian Hunt to York and Steve Lee to Dewsbury, while Phil Morgan retired at the end of the season. Brian Gaines was also injured and forced to retire. Alan Preece only made 3 appearances being second team player coach.

Top scorers were Marshall 78 goals and 4 tries followed by B. Lee 10 tries, Dunn 2 goals 7 tries, Thompson 8 tries, Hudson 7 tries, Clark and Crewdson 6 tries each. Tommy Thompson played in all 37 games with Crewdson in 35 games.

Thompson also made a much overdue appearance for Yorkshire v Cumberland and scored a try, while Morgan played 4 times for Wales scoring 1 try and Williams was his partner in one of these games.

The 'A' team were the surprise packets of the club despite great adversity. At Christmas the directors decided to disband the 'A' team for financial reasons but Eddie Bennett (the football committee man) and Harry Jepson (the secretary) told the players the decision and told them they didn't want to disband the side as they were a good team. The players, led by Alan Preece the coach, all said they would play for nothing for the rest of the season. Despite this they reached the final of the League and Yorkshire Senior Competition Cup, and the League match v Leeds attracted an attendance of 853. We beat Wakefield in the semi final of the league play offs and York and Featherstone to reach the final of the cup. The first final was at Castleford for the Championship which we won 12-8 with 3 goals by Nicholls and tries by Evans and Barron. The team was:— Nicholls; Barron, P. Evans, Simpson, J. Richardson; Blake, Barrass; Mason, Cardiss, Jarvis, J.N. Richardson, S. Evans, Preece and subs Rycroft and Maskill.

The second final was at Parkside for the Y.S. Cup but Castleford turned the tables before an amazing crowd of 2,480. The score was 15-23 with Nicholls scoring 3 goals and a try and Barron and Jack Richardson tries. The only change was Freddie Cliff coming in for Phil Evans, injured in the first game.


DAVE NELSON Former Leeds player who has been loyal to Huddersfield through the difficult years. A good wide out runner.



PLAYERS OF THE PAST CES THOMPSON

Nottingham City's football Director Ces Thompson will be remembered by any old ''Parksiders'' for Thompson began his footballing career with Hunslet back in 1948. Born in County Durham in 1927 Thompson came to Leeds in 1938 where he attended Blenheim School. Thompson played only a handfull of Rugby League games at school and his rugby involvement was more from the terraces, supporting Leeds.

In 1947 on return from service in the Royal Navy, Thompson got a job at the Yorkshire Copper Works in Stourton where he was surrounded by Hunslet supporters who provided him with much good natured argument. As a joke one of his workmates entered his name for the Copperworks Rugby League Team entered for the Parkside Workshops Competition.

Thompson decided to "have a go" and played at Parkside scoring a try in his first match for the Copperworks. With typical humour he remembers that his first score was gained "either by tripping over my opponents foot or my colleagues pushing me over". Nevertheless Thompson was a natural and Dewsbury, Bramley and Hunslet clamoured to sign him. He still thought it all a big joke until Hunslet put a written contract before him and Thompson became a professional Rugby League Player.

Jack Walkington was the man responsible for teaching the game to Ces Thompson and within three years Thompson was pulling on a Great Britain jersey for the 1951 test against New Zealand.

Thompsons debut for the Parksiders was against Hull KR in November 1948, but he had to wait until 1951 for his debut try against Castleford. He missed a number of games with a serious injury that almost brought retirement, but bounced back to complete 90 games and 9 tries for Hunslet before the powerful Workington side moved in for him in 1953.

ROCHDALE HORNETS' RECORDS

Rochdale Hornets' 92-0 home defeat of Runcorn Highfield on Sunday produced several records as follows:—

Highgest Rochdale Score:

Beating the previous best of 75-13 in a home Rugby League Challenge Cup tie against Broughton Moor Amateurs on 13th March 1915 when they scored 17 tries, compared with 16 on Sunday.

Runcorn Highfield's Biggest Defeat:

It was the widest margin defeat for Runcorn Highfield and equalled the most points conceded. Previously, they lost 92-2 at Wigan in the first round of the John Player Special Trophy on 13th November 1988. Wigan scored 18 tries.

Top Division Two Score:

It was the widest margin for a Division Two match and equalled the highest score. Previously, Leigh won 92-2 at home to Keighley on 30th April 1986 when they scored 16 tries.

Most Goals and Points by a Rochdale Player:

Steve Turner's 14 goals beat the 10 by fullback Herbert Lees in a 50-2 home defeat of Glasshoughton Amateurs in the first round of the Rugby League Challenge Cup on 19th February 1938. Turner added one try for a club record 32 points, beating the 27 points (9 goals, 3 tries) by centre F. Blincow in a 51-0 home League defeat of Normanton on 17th October 1903.

DONCASTER RECORD CROWD

Doncaster had a club record Division Two home crowd of 3,813 for the visit of Oldham on Sunday when they lost 20-22. It beat the previous best of 3,000 on 17th April 1981 when they lost 16-22 to York.

PAUL HARKIN'S AWARDS

Paul Harkin became the first player to twice win the White Rose Trophy as Man of the Match in the Yorkshire Cup Final when he helped Bradford Northern to a 20-14 victory over Featherstone Rovers at Headingley on Sunday. He also won the award against Castleford in the drawn final of 1987.

The scrum half is also the only player to twice win the Man of the Match Award in a John Player Special Trophy Final, with Hull KR in 1984-85 and 1985-86.

POINT SCORING RUN

Mark Aston has scored in 46 successive matches for Sheffield Eagles from the start of last season.

WINNING RUN

Rochdale Hornets have the current longest winning run of six matches all in Division Two.

LOSING RUN


Runcorn Highfield's 92-0 defeat at Rochdale Hornets on Sunday was their 20th loss in succession. They have gone 31 matches without a win including an 8-8 draw at home to Workington Town on 22nd January 1989. Their last success was 20-12 at home to Fulham on 30th October 1988.

MILESTONES


