



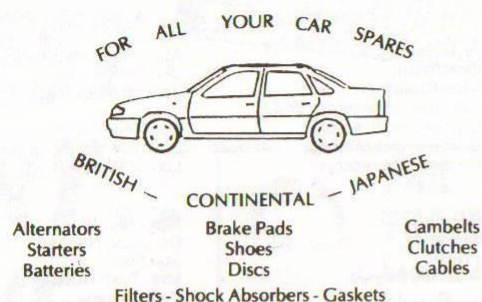

WAKEFIELD TRINITY

GARY SPENCER Returned to Wakefield in January 1991 after spending 3 and a half years with Leeds during which time he too often had to play understudy to big name imports Andrew Ettingshausen and John Gallagher. Made his initial Trinity debut against York in 1984, gaining Colts international honours. Joined Leeds in 1987, in exchange deal for Mark Conway, Keith Rayne, Phil Fox and Andy Mason. Played in Leeds' 1988 Yorkshire Cup winning team. A Wakefield Colts product, still only 25 and a fireman by trade. He has settled back at Trinity to quickly become one of their most valuable players.

CHRIS PERRY This young Australian utility back from Ayr in far north Queensland was signed whilst playing for local amateurs Ackworth, in October 1989 and is now into his third season with Trinity. Once banned from playing Rugby Union in Queensland because of professional ties he filled the No. 1 shirt at Trinity before revelling as Andy Mason's centre partner since the back end of 1990/91.

ANDY MASON Has been Trinity's leading try scorer for 3 successive seasons and at the end of the 1990/91 season had tallied 62 tries from 123 appearances. A former Roundhay RUFC player who turned professional with Bramley and immediately won Yorkshire honours — the first of six caps — in 1985. Signed for Leeds in a £40,000 transfer deal in October 1986 gaining squad inclusion for Great Britain's home Ashes series against Australia. Came to Belle Vue in a multi player exchange deal in the summer of 1987. A very illusive runner and sound in defence he has played mostly as centre with the occasional wing appearance for Trinity.

ANDY KELLY Began his career with the Club in the 1979-80 season, before moving to Hull KR in a record £60,000 deal for a forward in June 1982. Gained championship and England international honours whilst with the Robins, and appeared in their 1984 and 1985 Yorkshire Cup Final teams. Represented Yorkshire against Lancashire at prop, in 1986, before returning to Trinity in January 1988. He has had close season surgery on his shoulder but still a gifted ball handler and running forward.

JOHN GLANCY Was voted the Club's best player in Season 1990/91 after his whole hearted performance in the front row. A bargain £20,000 acquisition from Sheffield Eagles at the start of 1988/89, he has since made 77 first team appearances for Trinity before this season. Runs hard and straight and never shirks his stint in defence.

GARY PRICE After three seasons as a GB Under 21 International, Price has given up his job as an electrician to become the Club's first full time player, co-ordinating the Club's junior development work in the area. Toured New Zealand with the full GB Squad in the summer of 1990 but looked a little jaded at times during the ensuing season. Has been given the Vice Captancy this year and is certainly one of Trinity's best chances of making the Lions Tour Down Under.

JOHN THOMPSON The loyal long-serving front row or hooker who enjoyed a richly deserved benefit season in 1988-89, crowning the year by being adjudged Trinity's Player of the Year for the first time. Joined the club's Colts team from Eastmoor ARLFC in the late 1970's and was a member of the first team squad which went to Wembley to face Widnes in 1979. John has served the Club magnificently in more than 250 matches and played 31 first team matches last season.

BILLY CONWAY On his day one of the sharpest hookers in the game but lack of size is his only downfall — made only 16 first team appearances last year as he battled with John Thompson and Darren Carter for the number 9 shirt. Product of the Trinity Colts side in mid 1980's taking the Jim Challinor Trophy for his Man of the Match Display in the 23-10 defeat of Bradford in the 1985 Colts Challenge Cup Final.

ADRIAN SHELFORD Had a highly successful debut season for Wakefield in 1990/91 — won the Supporters Club Player of the Year award. Previously had 3 seasons with Wigan and 3 successive Wembley triumphs. The former Kiwi test prop toured in 1985 and has gained 6 caps with New Zealand.

ANDY WILSON Had his best ever season in 1990/91 playing for Trinity on the wing, finished second only to Andy Mason with 14 tries. Can create try scoring opportunities from nothing and his kick and recover try against Wigan at Central Park and his 50 yard effort in the last game of the season against Rochdale at Spotland were two of the most memorable tries of last season. He is a former Queens Park Amateur from Leeds who previously trialed with Sheffield Eagles in 1987/88.

DAVID JONES Became a Belle Vue crowd favourite in his debut season but picked up only 4 tries in 35 appearances and that is a figure he wants to at least better in 1991/92. He is a product of Wigan St. Patrick who toured the South Sea Islands with the BARLA squad before turning professional with Trinity. Won the Player of the Tournament award in the Wigan Sevens in August 1991.

TRACY LAZENBY Utility man who can play centre, stand off or in the back row had a disappointing 1990/91 season after a superb performance which won him the Player of the Match in the Yorkshire Cup Final last September. He is a former GB Colt International who on his day is one of Trinity's most clever players. Had a one season spell with Penrith in Australia's Winfield Cup Competition in 1989.

MARK CONWAY Appointed Trinity Skipper this season, a natural progression after being the team's play maker from half back. A prolific scorer he reached his 600 point milestone for Trinity in the last match of the 1990/91 season, this coming from 42 tries, 212 goals and 8 drop goals in his 133 matches to the end of 1990/91. Toured Down Under in 1982 with GB Colts and has made one appearance in GB Under 21 side against France in 1984. A local product from Stanley Rangers.

NIGEL BELL Bell made his debut as half back partner to Australian Legend Wally Lewis against Leigh in 1984. Last season he showed his versatility by playing in every position from half back through to front row. One of the games most consistent tacklers, he has played more than 200 first team games for Trinity.

NIGEL WRIGHT This promising stand off made three first team appearances at age 16 last season before a knee injury and then glandular fever halted his season. A former England schools representative, he stands six foot tall and weighs in at 13 stone. A product of the Stanley Rangers Club he has been earmarked as one of Trinity's stars of the future. Turns 18 in November 1991.

LYNTON MORRIS At 19, he was a boarder line first teamer in 1990/91 making 10 appearances including the gallant victory against Hull at the Boulevard in which he won Trinity's Player of the Match award. A tall second rower with a big appetite for defence, many feel he will progress to the front row in time. Had a late start to the season because of a knee injury but a player with a big future.

RICHARD SLATER Slightly bigger, more confident and certainly more experienced after 30 first team appearances in 1990/91, mostly at loose forward after a stint at full back. Comes from the Normanton Club as did coach David Topliss, Slater has his eyes firmly fixed on GB Under 21 International spot this season.

DARREN CARTER A 20 year old hooker who comes from Normanton, as does team mate Slater and coach David Topliss. The chunky number 9 made is debut as a replacement against Wigan at Central Park last March and made his only full appearance against Bradford at Odsal 10 days later. One of several of Trinity's promising local products who had a brief stint with Doncaster in 1989/90.

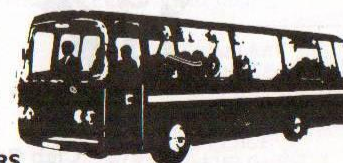

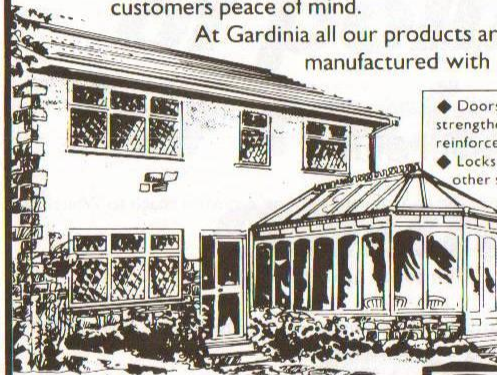

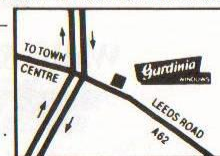

WIGAN TAKES UP FOSTER'S WORLD CLUB CHALLENGE

It's the Rugby League world title decider, staged at one of the country's most famous stadia.

British Rugby League Champions Wigan will meet the winners of this month's Australian Grand Final in the Foster's World Club Challenge at Liverpool FC's Anfield Stadium on Wednesday 2 October.

Wigan, who took the British crown in a thrilling championship finish last April, will know their opponents on 22 September when the Australian club title decider is played at the Sydney Football Stadium.

The last Anglo-Aussie title clash in 1989 saw Widnes defeat Canberra at Manchester United's Old Trafford ground. Foster's had earlier supported the 1987 meeting between Wigan and Sydney Aces Manley at Central Park, Wigan which led to the challenge being upgraded and granted official world status by the International Board and the Australian Rugby League.

The 1991 Foster's World Club Challenge at Anfield will kick-off at 8 pm with extended highlights being screened on BBC TV's Sportsnight later the same evening, plus live telecast in Australia.

Rugby League Chairman, Bob Ashby, said: "The Foster's World Club Challenge is an international showcase event which has previously attracted crowds of more than 30,000. The head-to-head confrontation will again determine the official title of World Club Champions boosted by record sponsorship from Foster's."

ABOUT THE JOHN SMITH'S YORKSHIRE CUP — 'NOT A LOT OF PEOPLE KNOW THIS!'



1991 marks the sixth year of John Smith's sponsorship of the Yorkshire Cup, and the eighty sixth year of the famous competition itself. It is the oldest Rugby League event of them all.

The 1990 John Smith's Yorkshire Cup title was won by Castleford, when they defeated Wakefield 11-8 at Elland Road, Leeds, in front of a 12,326 strong crowd. It was a close fought match, which contained just three tries, but Castleford's efforts in their twelfth Yorkshire Cup Final were enough to defeat the underdogs and give them their third Yorkshire Cup title in ten years. Despite this, the press voted Tracey Lazenby of Wakefield 'The Man Of The Match'.

In last year's competition, Hull Kingston Rovers also made their mark on the event despite not reaching the Final. They went into the record books for their 100-6 win over Nottingham. This was the biggest ever winning margin in the history of the Yorkshire Cup.

The 1991 competition marks the competitive debut of the Scarborough Pirates, who were accepted into the John Smith's Yorkshire Cup for the first time by the Yorkshire Rugby League. This brings the total number of teams competing in the event to 19, increasing the number of preliminary round matches required to three.

Since 1986, the first year of John Smith's sponsorship of the Yorkshire Cup, the winners of the tournament have been:

The John Smith's Yorkshire Cup continues to be one of the most popular sporting events in the country. Twenty one years ago the total number of spectators at all Yorkshire Cup matches was just 38,500. Last year over 85,000 people poured through the gates to watch John Smith's Yorkshire Cup matches producing £305,000 worth of gate receipts as they did so.

The 1991 competition is likely to prove as popular and colourful as ever, providing hours of top quality, competitive Rugby League for the fans to savour.

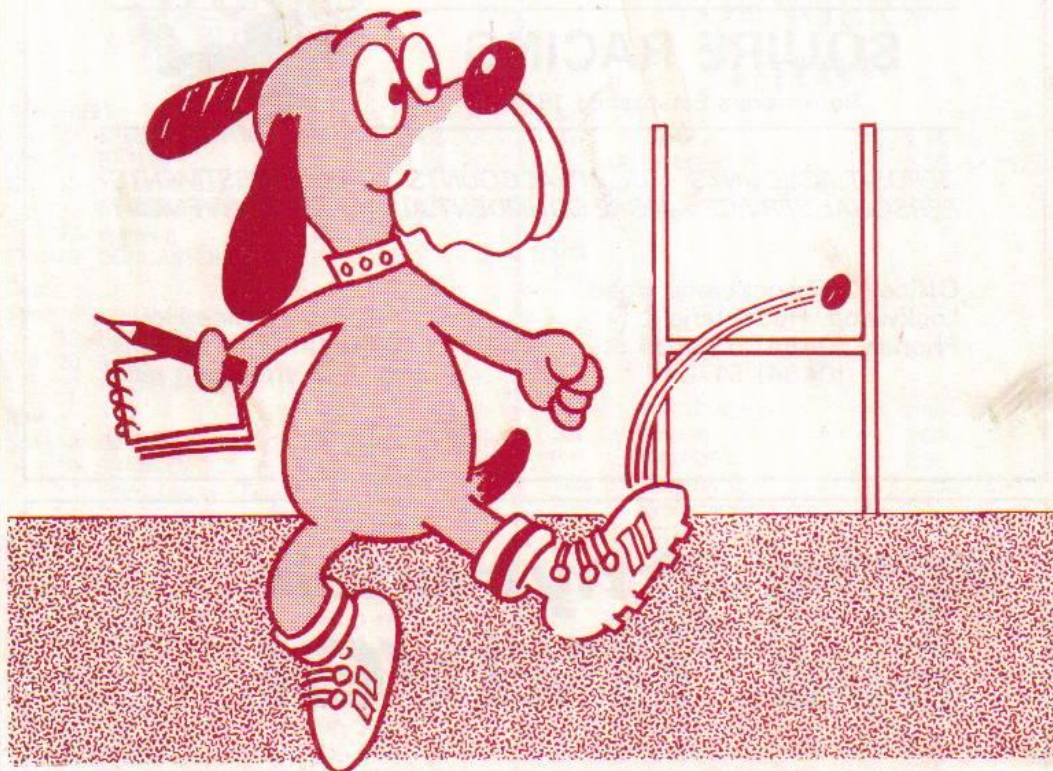
