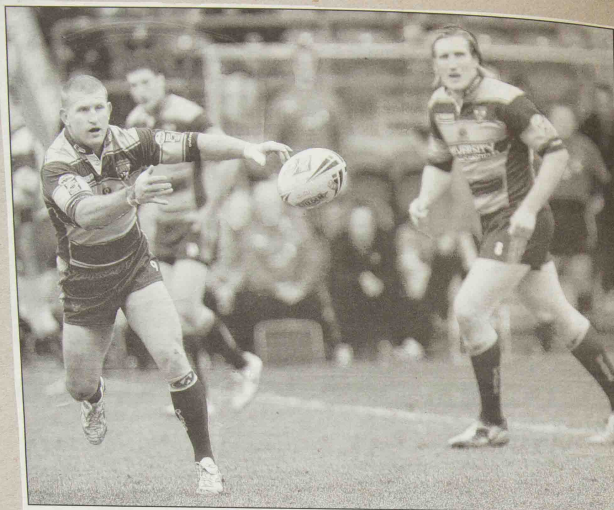

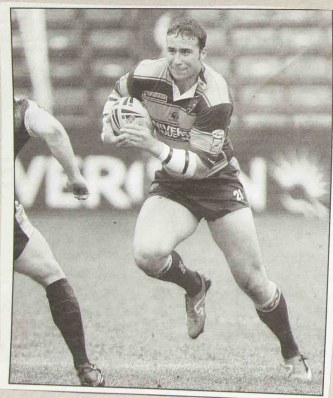

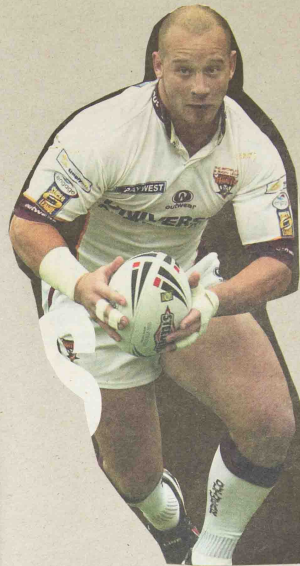

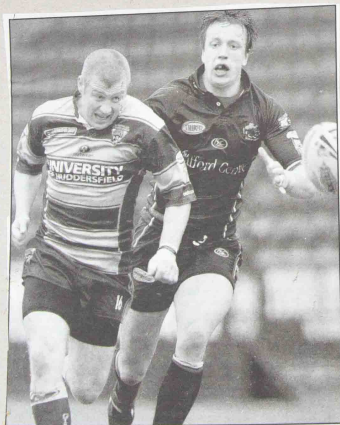

GIANTS forward Andy Raleigh is looking forward to tomorrow's Powergen Challenge Cup semi-final draw but warned: "Whoever we get it will be tough."

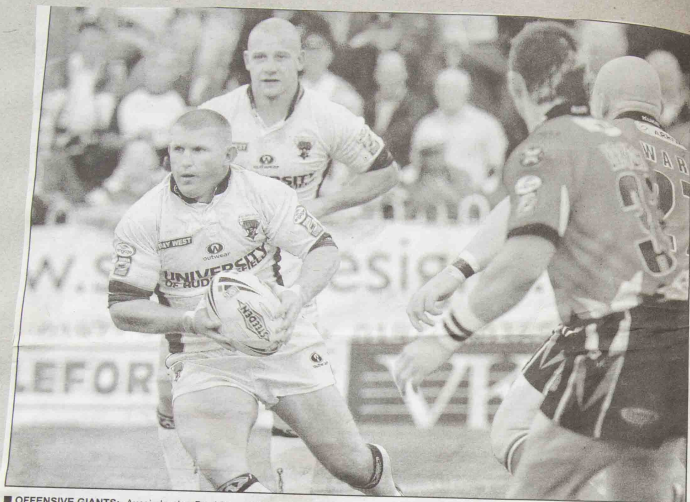

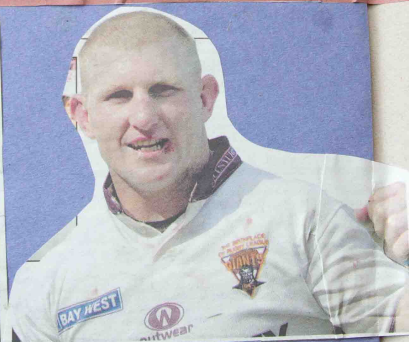

WE'RE READY TO GO!

PAUL REILLY

THE evergreen 30-year-old full back is the longest serving Giants player and is in the middle of his testimonial season.

This will be his last year as a professional and he will be determined to go out with a bang! The former Midgreen junior represented England in the 2004 European Nations Shield and was man-of-the-match in the win over Ireland.



MARTIN ASPINWALL

THE former Wigan winger was rewarded for a superb first season at the Giants by earning a place in the Great Britain squad at the end of 2006.

The power running of the 25-year-old has already made him a firm crowd favourite. He finished last season as the joint top try scorer with 15, earning the honour with Chris Nero.



JAMAH LOLES

A POWERFUL centre or winger, the 25-year-old played for New Zealand in 2005 and has won Australian NRL Grand Finals with the Canterbury Bulldogs and Wests Tigers.

He is a strong and very aggressive runner and is capable of playing anywhere in the three-quarters as well as in the back row. He is tipped to have a big year.



KEVIN BROWN

A 22-year-old utility back who has signed a three-year contract after impressing at the end of last season on loan from Wigan Warriors. He is a highly skilful player who will be sharing the goalkicking duties with Chris Thorman. He was in the England squad at the end of last season and is tipped for Great Britain.



SHANE ELFORD

ANOTHER new signing from leading Australian club Wests Tigers, the 25-year-old is equally at home at stand-off in the centre or on the wing. He had a try-scoring rate of one in every three games, which is a top-quality tally in the NRL. As well as being strong on attack, he is recognised as having a solid defensive game.



CHRIS THORMAN

THE talented 25-year-old who hails from the soccer-mad Newcastle, will again be club captain, having led them in last season's Challenge Cup final.

The talented goalkicking stand-off holds the Giants' record for most points in a Super League game. His vision, pace and kicking game make him a top star.



EORL CRABTREE

WIDELY acknowledged as one of the best young props in the game, the 24-year-old is firmly already established in the England set-up. At 180cm, he is the tallest player in Super League and is pushing for Great Britain honours. He possesses great strength and deceptive speed for such a big man and also boasts an effective offload.



BRAD DREW

WAS named the Giants' Player of the Year after yet another top season. The 31-year-old Australian hooker has missed only one game in the last two seasons and is a key man. He was man-of-the-match in last season's Challenge Cup semi-final win over Leeds and is a former Dally M Hooker of the Year in Australia.



JOHN SKANDALIS

ONE of the most highly respected and experienced props in the Australian game, the 30-year-old Australian arrives at the



with a massive reputation. He had 10 seasons at Wests Tigers and was in the side that won the NRL Grand Final in 2005. He will be expected to take on the role of Huddersfield pack leader and bring on young players.

CHRIS NERO

A 25-year-old centre or back-row forward who has become a firm crowd favourite since arriving from leading Australian



NRL club St George in 2004. His powerful and pacy running has caused every defence in Super League problems, and last season he finished joint top try scorer with 15.

ANDY RALEIGH

THE highly-powered back-row enjoyed a superb first season with the Giants in 2006 after joining from the



top National League 1 club full KR. The highly-rated 25-year-old Huddersfield-born star has earned widespread praise for his impressive strength and defence. Many pundits are already predicting him to be a future international.

STEPHEN VILD

THE former Wigan back-rower has been a part of the Great Britain set-up for three years and was a top-quality performer for the Giants throughout last season. The 25-year-old has shown he has the pace to be effective at centre, having scored several spectacular long-range tries.



STUART JONES

REGARDED as one of the most solid and consistent back-rowers in the game, the 25-year-old is a vital member of the Giants squad.



The former Wigan and St Helens player was an ever-present last season and is noted as being a defender of the highest order. Was signed thanks to the work of the Giants Squadbuilder Fund.

PAUL JACKSON

NOTED as the quiet achiever in the squad, the powerful prop has been a tower of consistency since joining in 2005. His workmanlike carries and good skills make the 28-year-old a handful for opposition defences. The Scotland star is one of the top metre makers for the club and began his career in the Giants Academy.



KEITH MASON

ANOTHER player to join the Giants on a regular basis after signing mid-season. A destructive runner, the 25-year-old prop is noted for his no-nonsense approach to the game. His arrival after spells at St Helens, Wakefield Trinity, Castleford and Australian club Melbourne played a big part in the Giants' upsurge in 2006 form.



PAUL SMITH

HE is a tough, no-nonsense back-rower who is in his fourth season at the club. The 29-year-old is an effective wide runner in attack and he has consistently been one of the top tacklers at the club, working tirelessly to plug any gaps in the defensive line. A former Rochdale Hornets captain, he became a full-time player when he finished university.



DARRELL GRIFFIN

A BIG, new signing from Wakefield where he was a stand-out performer for several years. The former England prop is one of the most physically dominant figures on a Super League pitch. The 25-year-old was introduced to the game at Oxford Cavaliers and if he can fulfil his potential will be a big hit with the fans at Huddersfield.



RYAN HUDSON

RETURNING to rugby league after two years on the sidelines following a drugs ban. Before then, he was captain at Castleford and was then set for a career at Bradford before his two years in the wilderness. After being in contention for Great Britain, the 27-year-old utility forward will be looking for a big year at the club where he began his career.



STEVE SNITCH

HE is now becoming accustomed to a life at the Giants after arriving from Wakefield. The 23-year-old utility forward is developing well and will be hoping to make a regular spot his own in 2007. Noted for his strong running, the prop or back-row forward is regarded as one of the top young pack players in the English game.



MAT GARDNER

HE enjoyed a solid debut season at the Giants after signing from Leeds, which included a very memorable hat-trick in the win over Catalans. The younger brother of St Helens ace Ade, he is a strong and powerful outside back who is one of the quickest men at the club. The 22-year-old will now be looking to really push on in 2007.



TOM HEMINGWAY

HAS been on the fringes of the first-team squad for two years and will be hoping to establish himself this time. A former England junior international, the talented 20-year-old can play scrum half, stand-off or full-back and has a quality kicking game to go with his top ball-playing skills. He will be looking to add to his six top-flight games.



SIMON GEORGE

ARRIVED at the Giants after starring for Huddersfield Sharks. The 20-year-old utility forward found his first year in Super League ruined because of injuries. Before picking up his bad knocks, the very promising young forward was developing rapidly as a player with an abundance of potential and he will be hoping some of that is fulfilled in 2007.



LEROY CUDJOE

THE former Newsome Panthers junior has earned a promotion to the Super League squad after starring for the Giants at Academy level. The 18-year-old is an accomplished full-back, but has also played at stand-off. He has earned representative honours and is now tipped to make the grade at the top level.

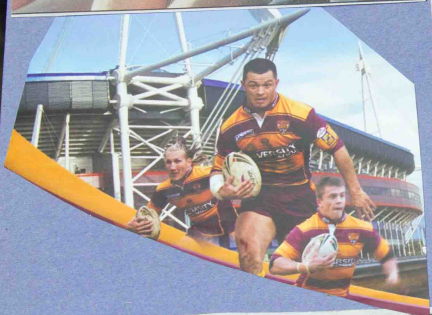

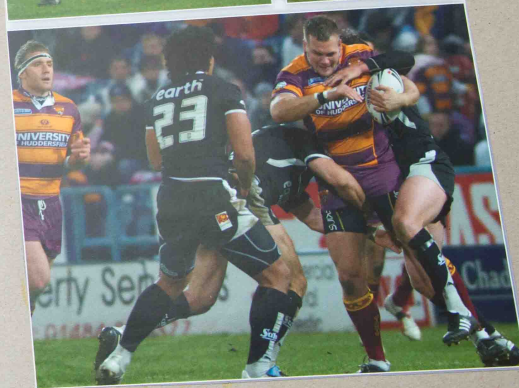
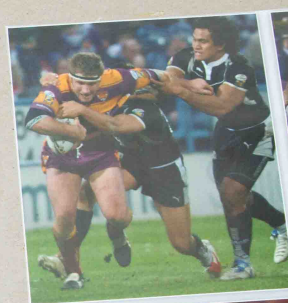

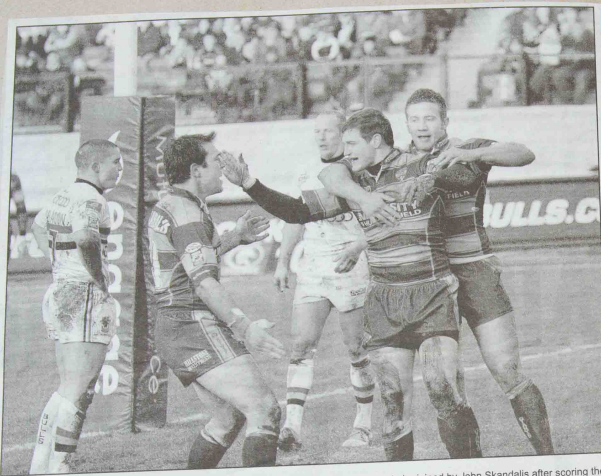

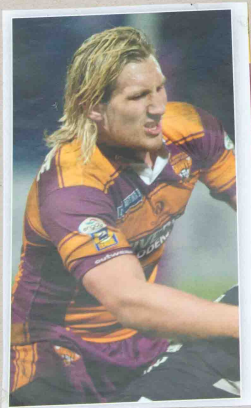

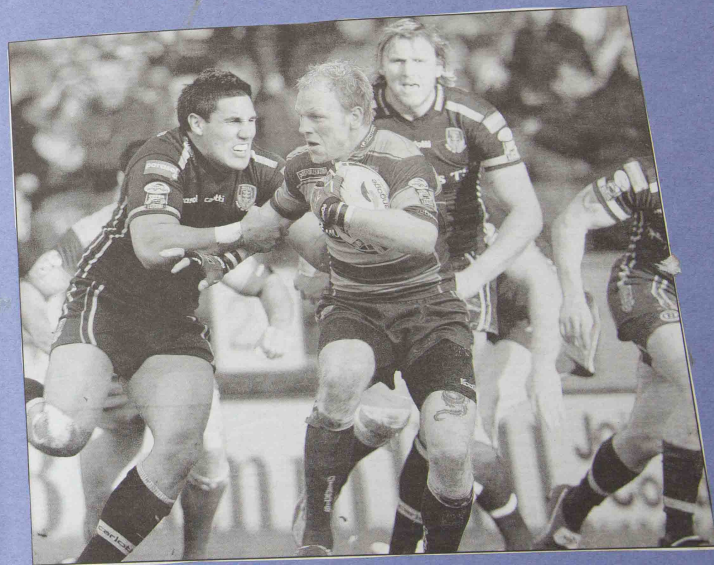

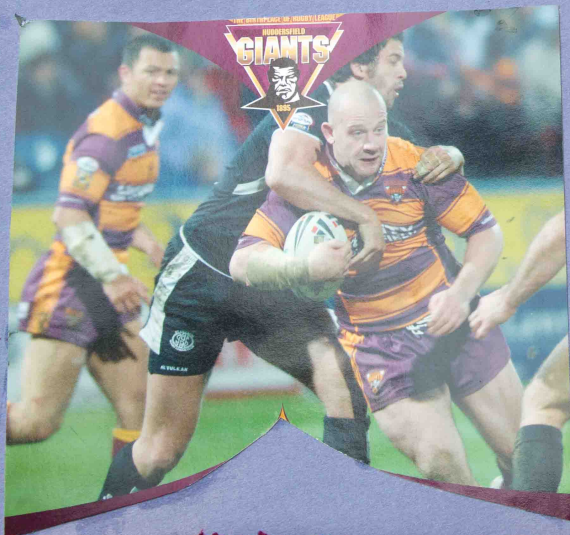
