

HUDDERSFIELD.
H. ARCHER (Capt.)
1890.

HARRY ARCHER commenced his football career 15 years ago in Bradford, with a junior club designated "Zingari." He next attached himself to the Old Manningham Club (now defunct) and afterwards figured in the ranks of the Bradford F. C., generally at full-back or as wing three-quarters, the same season that Park Avenue was opened. On one occasion he operated at half-back, and played brilliantly. Rather than submit to such chopping and changing, he joined the present Manningham Club, and became so popular during the two succeeding seasons, that he was appointed captain (1884-5), and so well did he pilot his team that it was only defeated by Batley in the final by eight minors to two. The following season he assisted Buttershaw. He next associated himself with the Huddersfield Club, and has done much towards placing it in the proud position which it now occupies as "Champion Club of the Champion County."
